Black History Month, also known as African-American History Month, is an annual observance in the Canada, United States and the United Kingdom for remembrance of important people and events in the history of the African American diaspora. (A diaspora being a "scattering, dispersion" "the movement, migration, or scattering of people away from an established or ancestral homeland" or "people dispersed by whatever cause to more than one location", or "people settled far from their ancestral homelands").

Black History Month sparks an annual debate about the continued usefulness and fairness of a designated month dedicated to the history of one <u>race</u>. (Race is a classification system used to categorize humans into large and distinct populations or groups by anatomical, cultural, ethnic, genetic, geographical, historical, linguistic, religious or social affiliation.)
